

Banjul, Gambia, November 25 (Infosplusgabon) - Gambia's Constitutional Review Commission (CRC) on Saturday resumed its nationwide consultations by holding two meetings within the Central River Region (CRR).

The meetings were part of CRC's inclusive drive of involving all Gambians in the dialogue on what should be or should not be included in the new constitution that is being drafted.

The consultation has taken the trekking CRC staff members who were divided into two teams headed by CRC's chairman, Justice Chernor S. Jallow and by its vice chairperson, Vice Chairperson Hawa K. Sisay to Janjangbureh and Bansang towns respectively both in CRR.

Addressing a large gathering in Janjangbureh which is the regional capital of CRR, Justice Jallow took the audience through the CRC's issues document which highlights questions regarding citizenship, how one acquires citizenship, questions relating to term limit for president, systems of government type of legislature among other things.

He also sampled opinions from the gathering on the controversial issue of death penalty asking if it should be included or not in the new draft constitution.

The CRC was established by an Act of parliament in 2017 and was formally constituted in June 2018 after the appointment and swearing-in by President Adama Barrow of eleven commissioners sixth of whom are female Gambian professionals with high integrity and social standing.
